COVID-19 Final Report for Bend Farmers Market

"Fresh Veggies for SNAP Participants (Double-Up Food Bucks)"

Summary of Results:

- The purpose of this project was to implement the Double Up Food Bucks (DUFB)
 Program, which provides an additional \$10 to SNAP users who chose to redeem their SNAP funding with farm-direct purchases at the Farmers Market.
- Products eligible for DUFB incentive redemption are: fresh, dried, or frozen whole or cut fruits and vegetables without added sugars, fats, oils, or salt. This includes mushrooms, cut herbs, dried beans, and edible plant starts.
- Every week of the Bend Farmers Market (BFM) (20 weeks in 2020), the BFM Manager operated the EBT machine that allows for SNAP redemption and that provides the DUFB incentive.
- Tracking for SNAP/EBT purchases will occur through the Oregon Trail Card purchase.
- The DUFB program was implemented for the first time at the Bend Farmers Market.
- 172 people were self-reported first time recipients of the DUFB program.
- Over the course of the BFM (20 weeks) 460 people received DUFB at the Bend Farmers Market in 2020 and were able to obtain an extra \$10 in produce per week at the Bend Farmers Market.
- DUFB recipients purchases included fruits and vegetables, mushrooms, cut herbs, dried beans, and edible plant starts in addition to their SNAP-eligible purchases.
